CURRICULUM VITAE

PROF. DR. ING. MANFRED FISCHEDICK, WUPPERTAL INSTITUT

is the scientific managing director of the Wuppertal Institute for Climate, Environment and Energy, an internal think tank in the field of sustainability and transformation research. In addition he is professor at the Schumpeter School of Business and Economics at the University of Wuppertal. Manfred Fischedick is member of various national and international advisory boards and one of lead authors of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change.

PROF. DR. ROLF WÜSTENHAGEN, UNIVERSITÄT ST. GALLEN

heads the Chair for Management of Renewable Energies and is Academic Director of the University of St. Gallen's certificate programme Managing Climate Solutions (www.macs.unisg.ch). He left one of the leading European energy venture capital funds to embark on his academic career, held visiting faculty positions at UBC Vancouver, CBS Copenhagen, NUS Singapore and Tel Aviv University, worked as lead author on IPCC special report on renewable energy and climate change, and advised the Swiss government on its Energy Strategy 2050.

PROF. DR. ING. MICHAEL STERNER OTH REGENSBURG

researches and teaches energy storage, energy economics and the integration of renewable energies at OTH Regensburg. He heads the Energy Networks and Energy Storage Research Centre FENES and has developed the storage technology power-to-gas. Together with Ingo Stadler, he has published the standard work "Energy Storage" as also other numerous scientific publications. He works on an honorary basis for the VDE, the VDI, the Federal Ministry of Economics and the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change. He acts in an advisory capacity for the Federal Government, the European Commission and is a member of the Bavarian Energy Advisory Council. He received several awards on power-to-X and energy storage technologies.

DIETER KOSSLICK, DIRECTOR, BERLIN

former director of Berlin International Filmfestival, just published his memories under the title "Immer auf dem Teppich bleiben", released by the publisher Hoffmann & Campe Verlag. The book includes a big chapter about the future of cinema and the substainability of filmmaking.

Since 2013 she is Managing Director of Constantin Film Produktion GmbH.
